What You Missed In November



Zachary Gartrell started off the meeting with several effects for our theme of "Dinner Table Magic". He did T. Nelson's Coin Manipulation along with Dai Vernon's effects by adding several objects to his routine. The routine was "Free and Unlimited Coinage Of Silver" as routine by David Roth.



Bill Baber performed "Slo-Mo" by Mark Leveridge. First the coin vanishes from the right hand and appears in the left. Then the coin vanishes from the left hand and joins a coin in the coin purse. Finally, the coin vanishes from Barry Mills hand and ends up in Bill's hand.



Mike Kinnaird did an effect by Paul Green called the "Pigmy Paddle" using Landon Davis as his assistant. He ended up with a "personalized, plastic, pigmy paddle from Poughkeepsie"!

Larry Lessner had Mike Kinnaird pick a card mentally. The thought of card was recorded on a business card and placed in a sealed envelope. A deck of cards was examined and the thought of card was missing from it, the card was later found in Larry's pocket. This effect was based on Millard Longman's "Acidus Novus".



Elmer Deffenbaugh did three silk routines. The first was Dai Vernon's "Vanishing Knot", the second was Marconick's "Silk Vanish Knot and Routine" and the third was "Expanded Sympathetic Silk Knot" for spooky untying knot.

First Harry Gallant performed a routine where he seemed to have a never ending supply of hotdogs to share with friends. Then Harry performed a prediction using an invisible coin with Watt Hyer as his assistant. Harry also performed a card routine in which his assistant Mike Kinnaird chooses a card that appears to vanish in the deck. When the same cards are shown to another assistant Watt Hyer, all of the cards are blank except for the chosen card.



Barry Mills did "Gadabout Coins" from BoBo's book of Modern Coin Magic.

Mike Dupree performed "Jiggernaut" by Mark Jenest. It is a "jigger and ball" routine that talks about the effects of

alcohol on one's perception of reality. It ends with corks instead of balls, the more you drink, double vision sets in.



Brandon Baggett performed "Water Trap" by Brother Gilbert/Paul Harris, with Andrew Clarke as his assistant. The dime is signed by both and Brandon places it in Andrew's hand. After placing an ignited matchbook over the hand, the coin vanishes from Andrew's hand and appears sealed in the matchbook flap.

Watt Hyer performed Dai Vernons "Coin's Through Table" with a wine glass and four coins. He also attempted a coin through table in which the coin was placed under a glass. The coin did not penetrate the table, but the glass did. webs, a spider appeared on her hand.
